- Be truly interested in those under your supervision for more reasons than just their athletic ability.
- Make an effort to get along with all people, associates, fellow faculty, alumni, other athletes and coaches, etc.
- Never see color in a person.
- Command respect by your actions, not by demanding it.
- Study the game. Always try to take advantage of every opportunity to increase your knowledge of the sport.
- Be able to analyze the situations during a game and make the adjustments —
 and those adjustments have to be taught in advance. If you haven't taught it,
 don't expect them to execute it with any degree of efficiency.
- Be a good teacher who pays attention to details.
- · Have character. Don't be a character.
- Have a level personality. Too many peeks and valleys with a fiery temper.
- Don't be an actor on the sideline. People should come to see your team play, not to see you coach. The team should provide the entertainment.
- Don't overcoach. Basketball is a simple game. Make it simple for your players.
 Don't confuse them with overcoaching.
- Learn each year. As you get older, be able to relate to a younger generation.
- The ideal coach must be flexible and change his system to suit the players he has rather than make them play a style they are not capable of playing.
- Be hard working, organized, enthusiastic, loyal and confident.
- Have honesty, integrity, patience and faith.
- Above all, be a good person.





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
